Harmful Gambling

In 2020, at least 7% of the UK population was affected by "harmful gambling." Statistics show that those involved in "harmful gambling" are more likely to experience financial difficulties and have poorer overall physical and mental health. The impact of "harmful gambling" is often severe: multiple studies report that gambling leads to bankruptcy and housing problems, including homelessness, and over a quarter of those involved in "harmful gambling" face divorce or separation. Conservative estimates suggest that the government spends one billion pounds annually providing services to those affected by "harmful gambling." Evidence indicates that the business strategies devised by gambling companies are likely to lead to "harmful gambling," such as advertising strategies targeting former gamblers and games designed to create addictive behaviours. It is estimated that 60% of the gambling industry's revenue comes from the 5% of gamblers involved in "harmful gambling."

The church should equip believers to seek social justice and prosperity. Reflect on how to live out Christ in their lives, view gambling companies, and treat those affected by "harmful gambling" with kindness.
